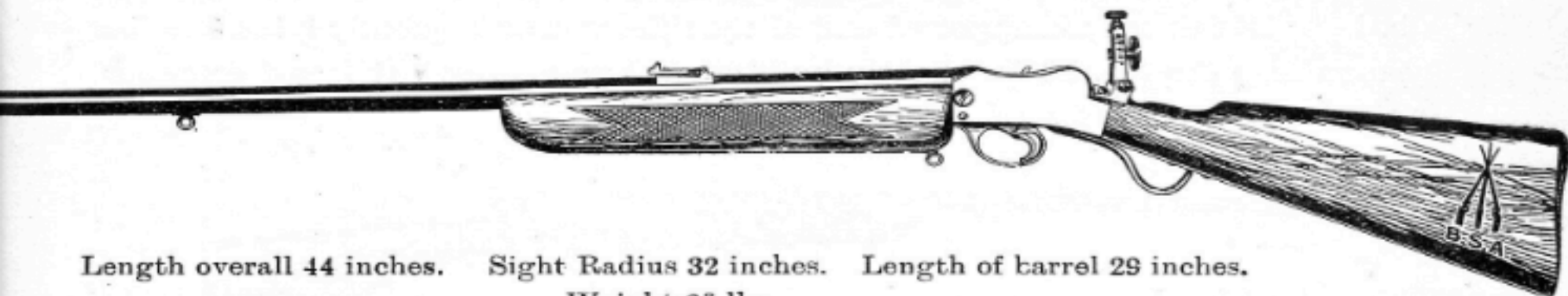


THE FAMOUS B.S.A. No. 12 TARGET RIFLE.

The ideal .22 cal. Super Club Rifle.

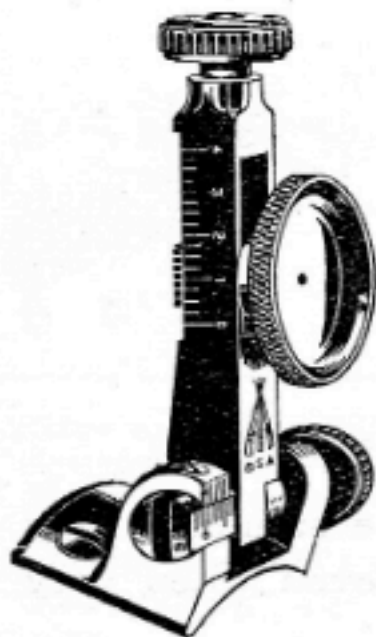


Length overall 44 inches. Sight Radius 32 inches. Length of barrel 29 inches.
Weight $8\frac{1}{2}$ lbs.

As will be seen by the measurements and weight noted above the B.S.A. No. 12 Rifle is solidly built and when properly held the trigger can be pressed without disturbing the aim.

Points.

- 1.—The Martini action is the best single shot action.
- 2.—It is the only single shot action that can be speedily reloaded for rapid fire practices.
- 3.—The action is easily dismantled for cleaning.
- 4.—The Aperture Sight is fixed out of the way of the hand, and it is far more rigid than when screwed into woodwork.
- 5.—The B.S.A. No. 8a Aperture Sight, with its six-hole eyepiece and half-minute click movements for elevation and windage, is possibly incapable of further improvement in manufacture or design.
- 6.—The B.S.A. No. 19a Foresight is neat and strong. The blade is clear cut and the ring is perfectly adapted for bull's eye shooting.
- 7.—The weight ($8\frac{1}{2}$ lb.) balance and comfortable feel cannot help but give one an advantage over an equally accurate rifle of another design.
- 8.—Even among B.S.A. Rifles some barrels shoot one cartridge better than others. We test them and find which brand of cartridge gives the closest grouping.
